This one day interactive conference is for all members of the Mental Health Services Multi-Disciplinary Team, Family Members and Carers, and those who use the services, a diverse mix that is sure to invite various approaches to promoting recovery in Ireland.

Following valuable feedback from the first joint conference in Dublin CPsychl and Shine decided to host the conference in a different location each year to increase engagement with those outside of Dublin, last year taking the conference to Galway, and this year moving south to Waterford.
